# **Standing Orders**

Your health care provider has given you a form (called a requisition) for lab tests that must be repeated (for example: once a week, once every 3 months). Tests ordered this way are called **standing orders**.



## The registration clerk and collector will:

- 1. Write an expiry date on your requisition.
- 2. Make a copy of the requisition to use at each visit.
- 3. Give you back the original requisition for your next visit.
- 4. Tell you when your requisition has expired.

Your requisition will expire 1 year after the date you receive it. Once it expires, you must visit your health care provider for a new requisition (if needed).

### Remember:

- Have your blood tested at the times given by your health care provider.
- Bring your requisition with you to each visit.
- Keep the requisition until it expires.
