Patients with potentially life-threatening conditions should immediately call 911. Emergency departments address the most serious and life-threatening health issues.

Call 911 for the following:

- ✓ Stroke/facial weakness
- ✓ New onset of weakness
- ✓ Heart attack/chest pain or tightness
- ✓ Unable to wake/unconscious
- Sudden onset of severe headache or confusion
- ✓ Seizure and/or severe head injury
- ✓ Major assault
- ✓ Severe difficultly breathing or trouble speaking
- ✓ Uncontrolled or severe bleeding
- Major trauma such as loss of limb or laceration
- ✓ Severe allergic reaction
- ✓ Severe burns

- ✓ Mild abdominal pain
- ✓ Limb sprains
- ✓ Mild headaches
- Minor infections
- ✓ Mild asthma
- ✓ Mild mental health support
- ✓ Simple fractures
- ✓ Earaches
- ✓ Skin and eye irritations
- ✓ Small lacerations
- Minor respiratory issues

Add your name to the *Need a Family Practice Registry*, our way of connecting Nova Scotians who do not have a primary care provider with a family practice. You can add your name to the registry by visiting **needafamilypractice.nshealth.ca** or calling 811. People on the registry are contacted in chronological order when a family practice in their area is accepting new patients.
